Marine Service Providers

The Marina del Rey Sheriff's Department is patrolling the docks throughout MDR to ensure that all marine service providers have a valid Commercial Service Identification Card. These cards signify that the service provider is allowed to be on the docks. Anyone without the card will be considered a trespasser and will receive a citation. This I.D. is issued by the MDR sheriff's station on Thursdays from 10:00am to 1:00pm. The cost is \$5.00, and a State Driver's License or Matriculate Identification Card is required.

Please help us ensure that the Marine Service Providers working on your vessel get their Commercial Service Identification Cards.

The Shuttle operates on Fridays (5pm-1:30am), Saturdays (12pm-2:30am) and Sundays (12pm-8:30pm). Visit www.mymarinaharbor.com for the latest time table. Pick up is in front of the Villa on the corner of Bora Bora and Via Marina.

The cost is \$1.50 per person per ride. Key Tags must be presented to board the shuttle. Boaters are allowed to bring up to three guests. Oil and Gas

Fact: Oil and Gasoline contain hydrocarbons and heavy metals that pollute and are toxic to aquatic life. Oil can coat the feathers and fur of wildlife, destroying their natural insulation. A single gallon of fuel can contaminate over a million gallons of water. Once ingested, oil moves up the food chain from tiny plankton to fish, birds and even humans, and can cause reproductive problems, weakness and death.

To Prevent Oil and Gas Spills:

- Use caution when filling your fuel tank and don't top off. Attend fuel nozzle at all times.
- Catch fuel drips with a rag. Properly dispose of soiled rags.
- Do not hose down gas spills, or apply detergents or soaps to an oil sheen.
- Install fuel tank vent whistles or fuel/air separators to avoid spills.
- Inspect fuel lines and hoses periodically.
- Use funnels for pouring oil and keep a supply of absorbent pads onboard for cleaning up spills.
- Dispose of used oil and drained oil filters at waste oil recycling center.
- If a spill occurs, notify the marina immediately.
